



Good Shepherd Campaign - Week 2

During this second week of the Good Shepherd Campaign, we invite you to visit the Archdiocese's website to watch the video of Archbishop LeGatt and our five seminarians.

The cost to support a seminarian is about \$45,000 per year. This includes accommodation and food, tuition, medical insurance and a monthly stipend. For international seminarians, it is also a question of legal fees and transportation to bring him from abroad. At least twice during his studies, we pay for a trip home to see his family.

The cost to bring in an international priest is about \$20,000. This cost includes legal fees, travel, two and a half months' salary paid by the Archdiocese during his enculturation, language classes if needed, and an allowance for him to stock up on supplies for his first winter here.

We invite you to discern in prayer to support the Good Shepherd Campaign 2024, because priests play a vital role in the Life of the Church. It is important that we continue to support international seminarians and priests in their vocations.

We invite you to pray for our seminarians as they continue to discern God's will in their lives and their journey toward the priesthood.
