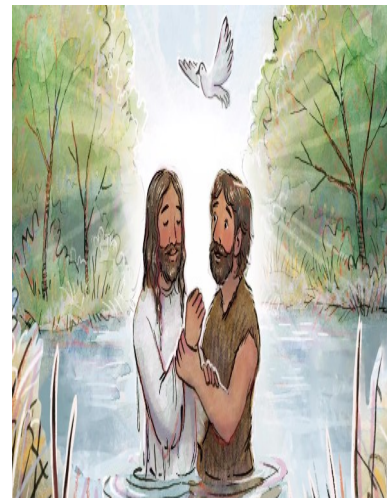

### The Baptism of The Lord:

The Baptism of the Lord marks the end of the Christmas season. It shows us how Jesus begins his public work. In all three years, the Gospel tells how Jesus is baptized by John. The heavens open, and the voice of God calls Jesus his beloved Son. This reminds us who Jesus is and why he came. The readings also speak about God's servant who brings justice and peace. They show that Jesus is gentle but strong. God's Spirit rests on him, and he brings light to all people. This day reminds us of our own baptism and how we are called to follow Jesus.



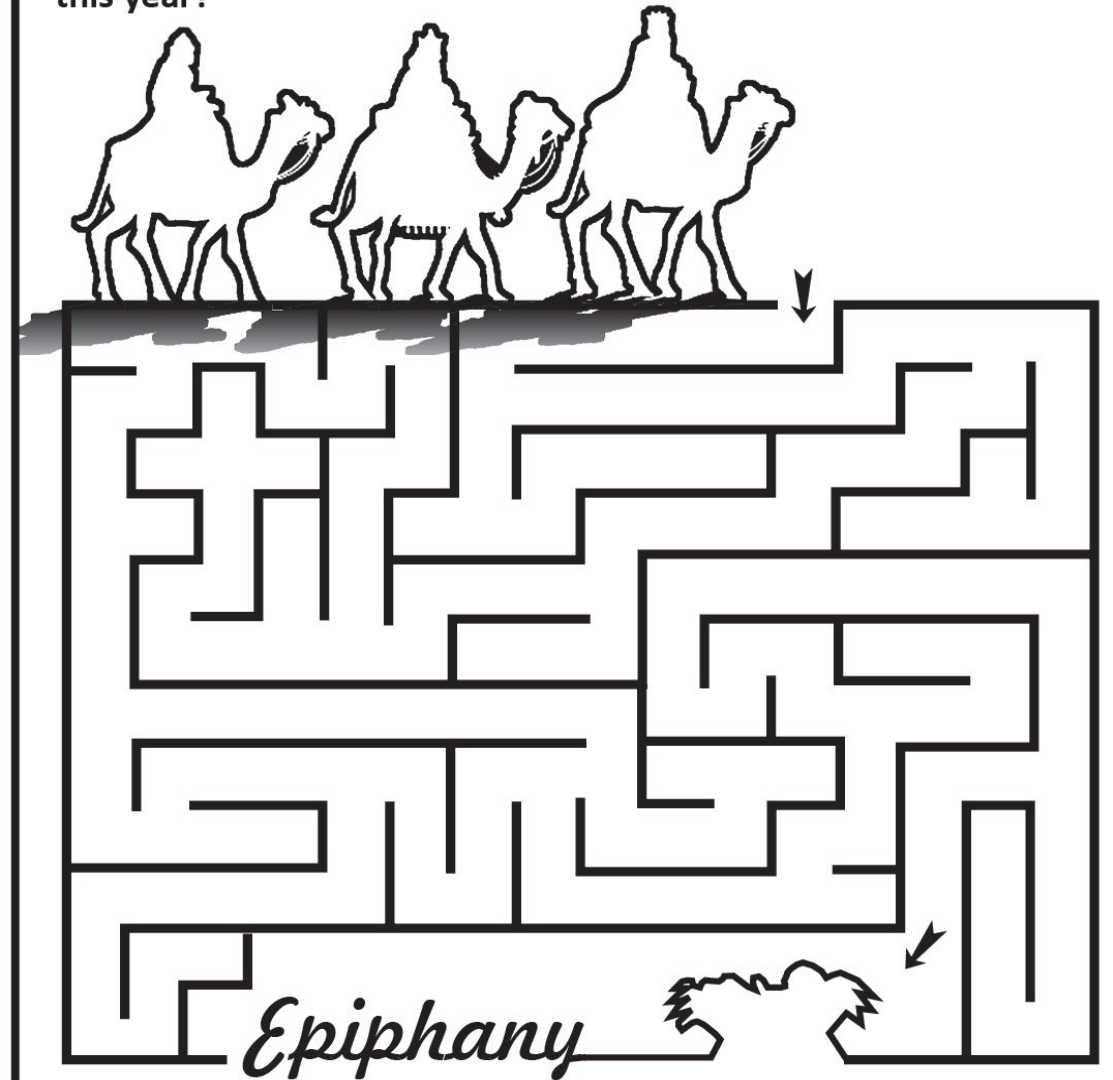
### Epiphany of the Lord:

"On the twelfth day of Christmas..." January 6, we celebrate the feast of the Epiphany! This special day celebrates the coming of the Magi - the three wise men (or kings), from the East who followed a star and came and adore Jesus. The Magi set out for Bethlehem and eventually they came to the house where Jesus, Mary, and Joseph were staying. They gave Jesus the gifts they brought for Him - gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Gold because Jesus is king; Frankincense because Jesus is God; and Myrrh because Jesus would one day die upon the cross to save us from our sins.

Three wise men were searching for Jesus. They traveled from very far away to meet him. They followed a star and finally found him in Bethlehem. They adored him and gave him special gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. **What gift would you like to give to Jesus this year?**
